#### Lapskaus

Adapted from nordicnibbler.com Makes 6-8 servings

- 2¾ lbs chuck steak, cut into ¾-inch pieces
- 6 large carrots, chopped into 3/4-inch pieces
- ½ lb parsley roots, chopped into ¾-inch pieces
- 1½ lbs rutabaga, chopped into ¾-inch pieces
- 21/4 lbs potatoes, chopped into 1/2-inch cubes
- 6 + 1/3 cup chicken stock
- 2 tbsp butter

- Freshly chopped parsley to garnish
- Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste Brown batches of meat in a casserole pot with melted butter. Add meat, chopped vegetables and chicken stock to the pot. Season as desired with salt and pepper and bring to a boil. Skim top of stew if needed. Cover with a tight fitting lid and simmer for 2½ hours. Stir carefully so that vegetables do not break down and become mushy. Taste and adjust seasoning as needed.If stew is too dense, thin with stock or water. Serve in bowls with a sprinkle of parsley and your

## Norwegian Pancakes - Pannekaken

Adapted from allrecipes.com Makes 6 servings

- 3 eggs
- 1½ cups milk
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp sugar
- ¼ tsp salt
- topping of your choice

Lightly mix eggs and milk in blender. Add flour, sugar and salt and blend until smooth and no lumps remain. Heat pan over medium-high heat. Coat pan with butter or cooking spray and add ¼ cup of pancake batter. Tilt pan to coat evenly with batter. Cook until the top of the pancake looks dry, roughly 30 seconds. Use spatula to carefully flip the pancake and cook

for a few seconds on the other side until browned. Roll served with your favorite topping of fresh berries, syrup or lingonberry jam.

# Support the Sons of Norway Foundation with Klubb

The Sons of Norway Foundation has a new Foundation level of giving program entitled Klubb 250, Klubb 500 and Klubb 1,000. This program is a sustaining membership drive that may be done on-line by credit card or by check. Donors will be given three choices to support: Heritage & Culture Fund for grants, Scholarship Funds or Humanitarian Fund. Sons of Norway members have been very loyal donors to the Foundation. We want to encourage members to make an ongoing commitment to growing the Foundation assets. You will be hearing the specific details by email blasts, newsletter articles, Sons of Norway's blog and Viking magazine.

Why begin now? Currently only one in five qualified scholarship applicants receive funding. These students are Sons of Norway's future. By doubling or tripling our current assets of \$6M we can provide scholarship aid to many more students (50-75). They will attain their degrees and move into the workforce as productive citizens.

Enlarging the Heritage & Culture Funds of the Foundation will give our local lodges and their communities the funding needed to bring quality Nordic themed programming to their areas: Festival participation, cultural presenters, art exhibits, musical offerings to name a few. We receive over 100 applications annually. We are able to partially fund approximately 70. Imagine larger Norwegian events in more locations. These will increase Sons of Norways' membership through better visibility. Sons of Norway will thrive.

Our Humanitarian Fund has been called on many times since its inception in 1997. To date we have given over \$500,000 in natural disaster aid. In 2004 the Foundation created the Helping Hands to Member grants. Every year since then, Sons of Norway members across the US and Canada have received individual grants to help them recover following natural disasters including hurricanes, tornadoes and floods. 

family's stories from the Red Lake Reservation, as well as stories of Ojibwe people around the Great Lakes, Child examines the disruptions and the continuities in daily work, family life, and culture faced by Ojibwe people of Child's grandparents' generation—a generation raised with traditional lifeways in that remote area. Government employees and programs controlled reservation economies and opposed traditional practices.
