

Matlyst Monthly Kvikk Lunsj with Apples and Mascarpone Cream

Kvikk Lunsj is the Norwegian equivalent of the wafer and chocolate Kit KatTM bar. Introduced by Freia founder and hiking enthusiast Johan Throne Holst in 1937 as the perfect portable snack to enjoy while hiking or skiing, Kvikk Lunsj has become a favorite of Norwegians during eastertime family hikes and crosscountry ski trips to the mountains

- 3 apples, peeled and coarsley chopped
- 2 lemons
- 2 tbs. icing sugar (powdered sugar)
- 1 tsp. cardamom
- ¾ cup mascarpone
- 2 tbs. icing sugar (powdered sugar)
- 4 Kit Kat[™] bars (Kvikk Lunsj), coarsley chopped

Add chopped apples, sugar, cardamom and juice from two lemons to a pan. Cover with lid and simmer for 2-3 minutes. Mash apple compote with a whisk and cool. Add remaining sugar to mascarpone and whisk together. Serve apple compote topped with mascarpone cream and coarsley chopped chocolate bars in a glass or a bowl and enjoy.

SONS OF NORWAY DUES TO INCREASE.....

In August 2016 at the International Lodge Meeting in Tacoma, a new dues structure was voted in by a strong delegate majority vote (121-32). This resolution applies to dues within the United States only. Simplified Dues Resolution

WHEREAS the current dues structure and membership categories are complicated and very hard to explain to prospective members AND for current members to understand; and,

WHEREAS the 2014 meeting of the International Lodge passed a resolution for a committee to present a resolution in 2016 to simplify the current membership classifications to include Insurance/Social and Individual/Family and to make total dues for each lodge consistent within each country;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the following law changes will be made to accommodate a more simple dues structure. As it states in the Constitution, the International Board of Directors will set dues annually at the Spring meeting. **Effective January 1, 2018**, the U.S. dues will be \$60 for an individual and \$95 for a family. The breakdown will be allotted as follows:


