
At its heart, Midsummer celebrations are about connecting with the outdoors. In the past, girls would pick wildflowers and put them under their pillows at night in hopes of future good luck. Your family can easily adapt this tradition to today by taking a hike outside to enjoy a break from the normal hustle and bustle of modern life.

A good Midsummer celebration has to include a bonfire. In pre-Christian times, bonfires were thought to awaken the Earth after its winter slumber. Today they're a great way to bring the family together and bridge the gap between Norwegian and American customs.

Just like here, many Midsummer bonfires in Norway include hot dogs and s'mores, something that will likely be a big hit with your family at home. However, good food is always popular and Midsummer is no exception. Don't be afraid to incorporate other Norwegian recipes into your celebration, too. Finally, once you have the family together around the bonfire and you've had your fill of food, share some Norwegian folk-tales. Matlyst MonthlyMidsummer Campfire Bread and Hot Dogs

- 1½ cup warm water
- 3 tsp active dry yeast
- 4 cups (or more) all purpose flour
- 1 tsp sugar
- 2 tsp salt
- 2 tbsp olive oil + a little extra
- 12 Hot dogs
- · Long sticks, bamboo poles or metal skewers
- Ketchup and mustard

Mix warm water and yeast in a bowl or standing mixer. Let stand for 5 minutes or until yeast dissolves.

Add remaninging ingredients, stirring until well combined. If using a standing mixer, mix with dough hook for 5 minutes, otherwise transfer dough mixture to lightly floured surface. Knead until smooth, add flour in increments if dough is sticky. Continue kneading for at least 5 minutes. Cover with plastic wrap and let dough rise in a warm area until the dough doubles in size, roughly 1 hour.

Punch dough down and drizzle with olive oil. Transfer to a portable bowl with a lid.

Prepare a fire and let it burn down to red coals. Thread a hot dog onto a skewer or stick. Take a small plum sized portion of dough and roll between hands until you have a rope. Twist dough around hot dog and hold over coals, rotating until bread is golden and cooked and hot dog is warmed.

The Coulee Region rosemalers are proud to present the annual Heritage Tent from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday only, May 20 inWestby, WI. The tent is located on Main Street, between the Bekkum Memorial Library and Westby City Hall. The tent is provided through a generous donation from Owen and Naomi Bekkum.

The Heritage Tent is a gathering place for traditional Scandinavian items to be displayed. Folk artists will be demonstrating their crafts including: carving in several different styles by the Coulee Region Woodcarvers; father and son, Monroe and Taylor Johnson and Tip Bagstad will be displaying acanthus and flat plane carving, and Jan Jensen will display chip carving. Other carvers are always welcome to come and whittle and visit.

Jon Lee will display his Norsk influenced pottery and his Norwegian knives; Diane Hoven will have her traditional Hardanger embroidery display; Mary Gehle will display tatting; Mary Lake will charm visitors with her skills working with fibers, felting, and lucet braiding along with knitting and a quilting display highlighted by her husband Bob Lake's chip carving.

Paul Hatlem will have a display of Norwegian and local photography. His award winning photography is well known for it's vivid colors. His father Roger Hatlem will also be in the Heritage tent with a display of his famous figure carvings.

This year there will be a "Scandinavian folk music jam session" from noon until 4:00 pm. Also there will be an antique record player playing old 78 records in Norwegian. Musicians are invited to join in the jam session. Special appearance by Liz & Jesse with guests "Kickapoo Joy Juice" from 1:00-3:00 pm.

A display of bunads from different areas in Norway will be in the tent with live models. The Syttende Mai Heritage Tent wouldn't be complete without baking demonstrations. Joyce Quarmstrom will be demonstrating the Norwegian delicacy krumkake and Renee and David Moilein will be making lefse. So follow your nose to the Heritage Tent on Saturday and enjoy a free sample.


