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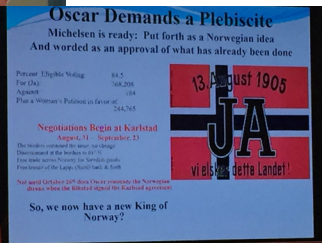
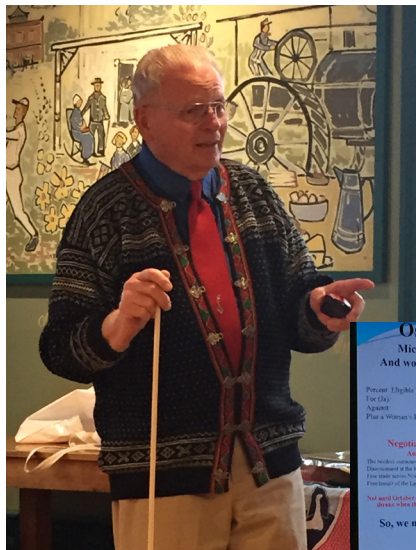
APRIL MEETING

HOW DID KRISTIANIA BECOME OSLO?

The name Oslo originally was given to a settlement at the north tip of the Oslo Fjord, now called Gamlebyen (Old City). In the Middle Ages, the name was spelled in various ways in Old Norse, including Ansló, Ásló, and Ósló (first in 1225). In Low German it also was written Ansló, perhaps due to its nasal pronunciation. The word Oslo is a compound of two words, os meaning “river mouth,” and lo meaning “flatland.”

After storbrannen (The Great Fire) that destroyed Oslo in three days in August 1624, the city was rebuilt on the west side of the Bjørvika inlet and renamed Christiania, after King Christian IV of Denmark and Norway. In the late 19th century, the name was respelled with a capital K instead of a C, to make it more Norwegian, first by the national government 1877 and then informally by the city in 1897. The switch from C to K was never formalized, so the two spellings coexisted, along with contractions such as Chr. and Chra, as well as Xania, as the letter X was then much used as an abbreviation for Christ in personal names and in church registers.

In the 1860s, prominent city residents, including painter and women’s liberationist Aasta Hansteen began using the name Oslo. After the dissolution of the Union with Sweden in 1905, public opinion increasingly favored the name Oslo, culminating in July 1924 with a decision by the Storting (Parliament) that as of Jan. 1, 1925, the capital was to revert to the name Oslo.

So it has been since then. Oslo is Oslo. But the city has nicknames, most enduring perhaps Tigerstaden (Tiger Town), after a poem by Norwegian poet and 1903 Nobel literature laureate Bjørnstjerne Bjørnson describing a fight between a tiger and a horse, with the tiger representing the dangerous and unfriendly city, and the horse representing the safe rural village. In commemoration of its millennium in the year 2000, the City of Oslo commissioned the bronze statue of a tiger that now stands in the square in front of the Oslo S main rail station.

LANGUAGE PRACTICE with Christie Ericson



The 17th of May will soon be here again (Snart er det atter en gang 17. mai) and Norwegians are preparing to celebrate (og nordmenn er i ferd med å gjøre seg klare til å feire) Norway's Constitution Day (Norges grunnlovsdag). The huge children's parade (Det enorme barnetoget) on (på vei opp) Karl Johans gate in Oslo

is a well-known image of Syttende Mai (er et kjent syttende mai motiv), but Norwegian groups around the world (men grupper av nordmenn rundt omkring i verden), both large and small (både store og små), also celebrate (feirer også) their heritage (kulturarven sin) on this day (på denne dagen).

One of Norway's (Én av Norges) most well-known national songs is (mest kjente nasjonale sanger er) "Norge i rødt, hvitt og blått" and on (og på) Syttende Mai it's very popular (er det veldig populært) to decorate in red, white, and blue (å pynte med rødt, hvitt og blått) and wave the Norwegian flag (og å vifte med det norske flagget). Many people also wear (Mange

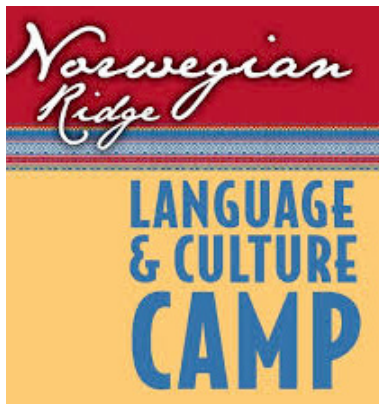
har også på seg) ribbons in red, white, and blue (sløyfer i rødt, hvitt og blått).

It is also customary (Det er også vanlig) to wear a (å bruke en) bunad or (eller) folkedrakt on Syttende Mai. A woman's bunad (En damebunad) generally consists of (består vanligvis av): a shirt (en skjorte), a bodice (et liv), a skirt (en stakk), an apron (et forkle), a shawl (et sjal), and shoes (og sko). Accessories include (Tilbehør inkluderer): a bag (en veske), a knife (en kniv), a cape (en cape), and a cap (og ei lue).

A man's bunad (En herrebunad) generally consists of (består vanligvis av): a jacket (en jakke), a shirt (en skjorte), a vest (en vest), long pants (langbukser) or knee breeches (knebukser), stockings (strømper), garters (hosebånd), suspenders (bukseseler), a hat (en hatt), and shoes (og sko).

Silver (Sølv) is also an important part of a (er også en viktig del av en) bunad and can include (og kan inkludere): brooches (søljer), buttons (knapper), clasps (spenner), and cufflinks (og mansjettknapper). The Norwegian Council of Folk Costume (Norsk Institutt for bunad og folkedrakt) has rules (har regler) for what can be considered (om hva som kan betraktes som) an official bunad (en offisiell bunad).

Matlyst Monthly Norwegian Knekkebrød

Enjoy this flavorful and easy to prepare treat.

Recipe from Christopher Mohs,

Vikingland Lodge 1-495, Detroit Lakes, MN

Ingredients

- 1 cup whole wheat flour
- 1/3 cup flax seeds
- 2/3 cup rolled oats
- 1/3 cup sunflower seeds
- 2/3 cup hazelnuts (ground)
- 1 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 cup water



Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Mix all dry ingredients together in a bowl. Then add water, 1/3 cup at a time, and mix in until you get a consistency of moist gravel (it should clump together when pressed into a ball, but not be too soggy). You may not use all of the water. Next, on a parchment lined baking sheet or tray (about 9 x 13 in size) dump out the mixture and press into one even layer with a spatula. Using a pizza cutter, score



your Knekkebrød into rectangular pieces and bake for 60 minutes. Remove and allow to cool down slightly. Break apart bread into your pre-scored rectangles and enjoy with your favorite jam.

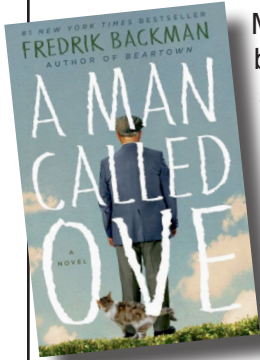
CONGRATULA- TIONS JUDY!

Rain or shine there is fun for the entire family at Midsummer Fest. Norskedalen is bustling with activity throughout the weekend.

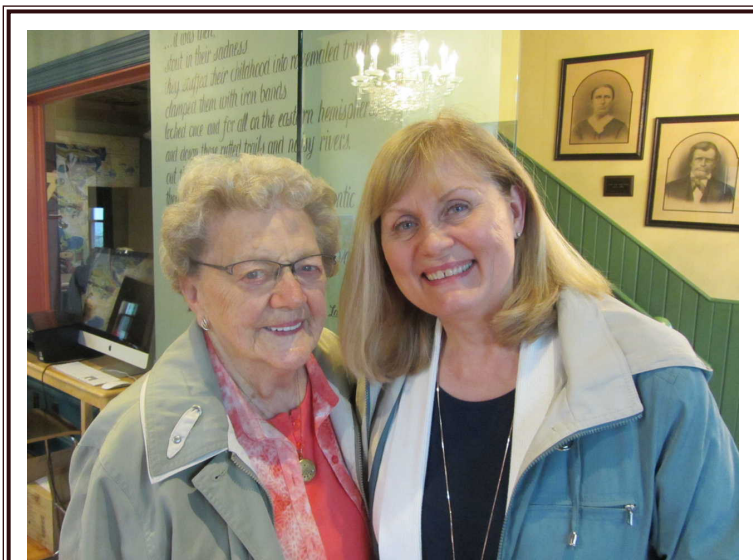
