To earn such a medal, you must enter projects in Vesterheim's Norwegian-American Folk Art Exhibition. A panel of judges evaluate and award ribbons, which are worth points that accumulate toward a Vesterheim Gold Medal. David's first points in woodworking were in 2017. David loves his gold medal so much, he may have it bronzed! (haha -- David's words)

Norwegian Potato Stew

This dish is great for leftover vegetables and meats, as well as simple vegetables you might have in the fridge

Serves 6

15 minutes prep time; 30 minutes cook time

Ingredients:

- 2 turnips, peeled and cubed
- 3 lbs. russet potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 2 carrots, peeled and cubed
- 1 stalk celery, cubed
- 1 onion, diced
- 8 oz. ham steak, cubed
- 2 Tbsp. salted butter
- 1 quart chicken broth
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 Tbsp. fresh parsley, minced
- Kosher salt and freshly cracked black pepper, to taste

Directions:

1. Using a large Dutch oven or heavy-bottomed pot, add all ingredients to the pot and bring the stew up to a simmer. Let cook for 20-25 minutes or until the vegetables are soft.

2. Season the stew with salt and lots of cracked black pepper. Using an immersion blender or hand masher, lightly blend some of the stew to create a thicker viscosity. Garnish with parsley.
3. Enjoy!



A LITTLE VALHEIM HISTORY

We have had some of our Sons of Norway, Valheim Lodge's memorabilia tucked away at the school for many years. With the upcoming remodeling at school, it was time to take our stuff out of the cabinet where it has been sitting for over 20 years. In the cabinet there was the officer regalia (Bill Fried is wearing one in the Committee photo on page 4), song books, a couple secretaries books, some membership receipt books, some other odds n' ends, and this framed Charter for Valheim Lodge.

On the bottom of the document, it says the lodge was founded December 7, 1928, and the charter is dated October 17, 1933. Maybe someone knows why there is a lapse of five years with "founding" and getting a "charter"?

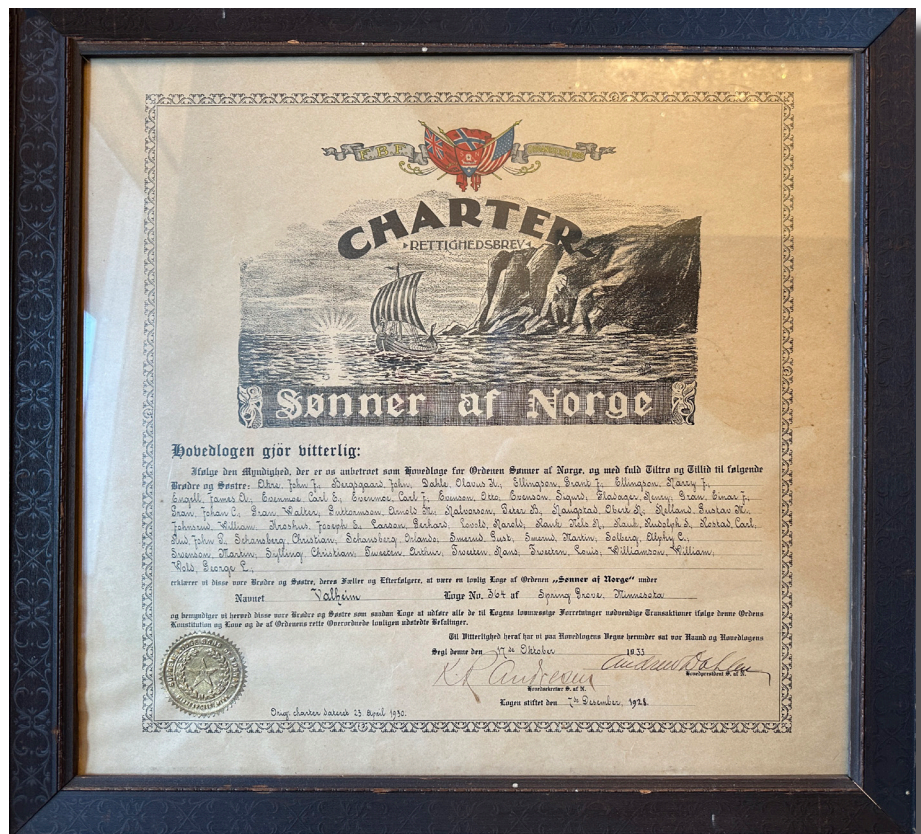
The printing is in Norwegian and it roughly translates (using Google translate) to :

"According to the Authority, which is entrusted to us as the Main Body of the Order Sons of Norway, and with full faith and trust in the following Brothers and Sisters".... then there is the hand written list of Valheim members, followed by, "we declare these our brothers and sisters, their followers and successors, to be a lawful lodge of the order Sons of Norway".

From the best that I can read someone else's penmanship, this is a list of the members on the charter:

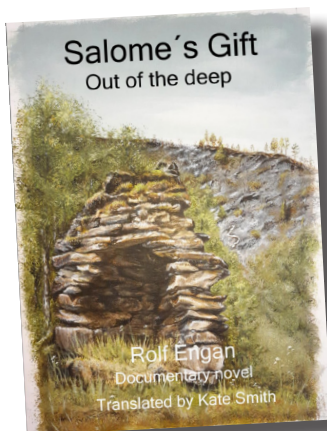
HOW OSLO GOT ITS NAME

The capital of Norway—Oslo—is one of the easier names to pronounce in the list of Norwegian cities. However, Oslo hasn't always been its name. In fact, it has taken on a few different names throughout history. Originally, the name was Ånslo or Åslo around the year 1040. It is believed that the

second part of the name, 'lo', meant "meadow" and the first part of the word, 'Ås' meant "hill" or "ridge", which makes the entire name translate to "meadow beneath the ridge." In 1314, when the city officially became the capital, the spelling transitioned to what we know today: Oslo (pronounced "ooh-shloo") However, when the city burned down in 1624 and plans were discussed to rebuild, King Christian VI



of Denmark and Norway decided the new city would take his name and become Christiania. With the language reform movement that followed in the next few centuries, the city was then spelled with a K, becoming Kristiania. Finally, around 1924, the city went back to its roots and was officially renamed Oslo, which stemmed from some of the eastern parts of the city being referred to as "Oslo" in maps at the time.

**We will be discussing "Salome's Gift"
by Rolf Engan.**

The book follows the lives of Salome Raaen (1759-1848) who lived for more than 50 years in the depths of a ravine in Ruglraaen – south of Trondheim, Norway. The story transitions to Salome's grandson's, Iver, Bersvend and Ingebrigt. It chronicles the contrasting lives of the brothers alternating between Bersvend in Norway and Iver and Ingebrigt who emigrated to America in 1853 and eventually settle in Waterloo Ridge. Drawing upon the faith passed down to him, Iver becomes the first priest for the Waterloo Ridge community. This novel is based on letters Iver Raaen (Salome Raaen's grandson) sent to Norway in the mid-1800s from America.

Valheim Lodge member Donna Rasmussen, who is a relative to the characters in this book, will lead our discussion.

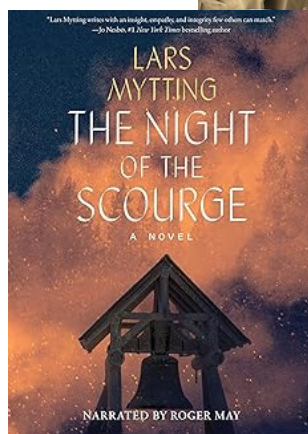
